Generating economic benefits for local communities and supporting local businesses, while ensuring that tourism revenue is used to support conservation and development efforts.



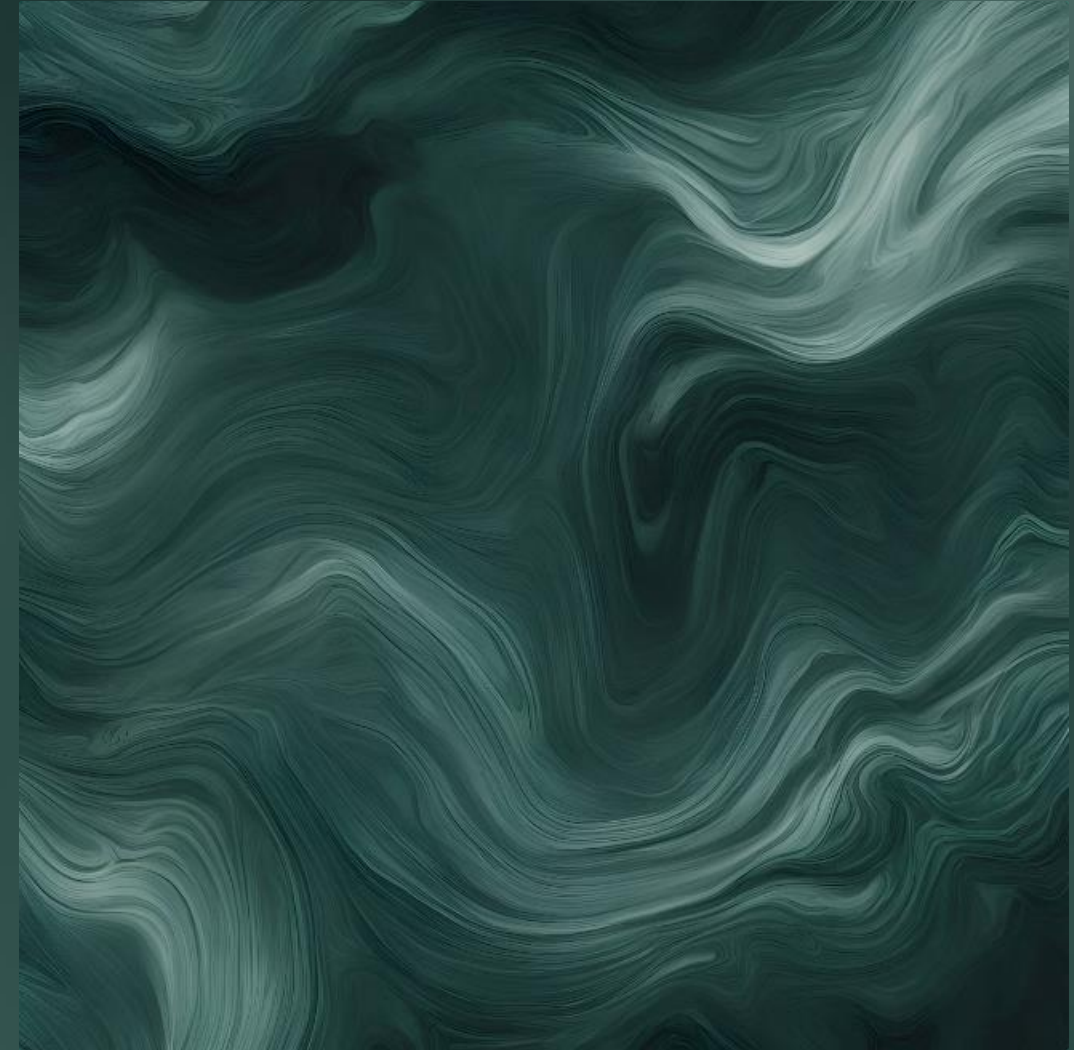
Community Engagement

Lack of Funding

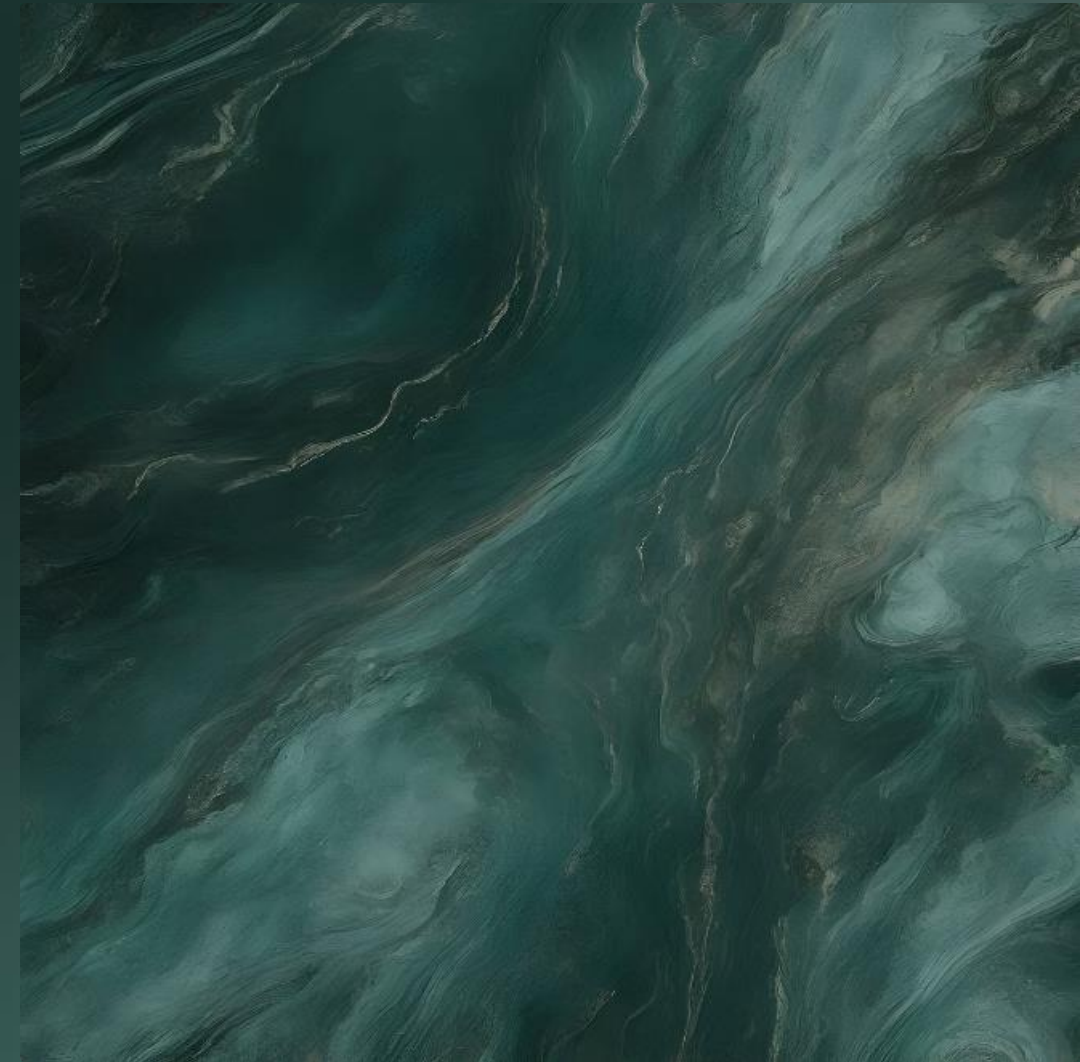
